Summer Employment – General Information

The Harness Horse Youth Foundation (HHYF) is a not-for-profit organization whose mission is to provide educational experiences to young people about harness horses and Standardbreds. Part of the activities of HHYF are summer camp programs which include 1-day and multi-day events which take place in the Midwest and Eastern United States.

Positions of summer assistant and/or truck driver are offered; these positions may be combined if suitable candidate applies. The following information outlines duties for both positions.

As a summer employee, you will be expected to participate in all facets of the camp process. From registration to barn work to extracurricular activities, your enthusiasm, willingness to get involved, and to interact with the kids and horses are extremely important in making each camp a success, both from the participants' perspective as well as the organization's. Responsibilities may include planning routes, driving the truck and trailer, setting up and tearing down of stable, stable management duties like scheduling farrier and ordering feed, organizing horse-related race night activities, assisting with jogging during camps, exercising the horses on off days, following HHYF safety procedures at all times, and other assistant duties as needed.

If hired, you will not have a regular schedule nor days off. Given the camp format and the regular responsibilities of caring for horses, the job is continuous throughout the duration of employment. Of course, there will be time to do laundry and other basic tasks but actual free time is very limited. Days are long and hot, nights are hectic, and the work is fun but intense. On travel days, you will be driving many hours to reach our next destination in time to set up and start the process again.

Compensation will be discussed upon interview.

Approximate length of employment – June 1 to August 15.

HHYF summer employment is unique in that offers different aspects depending on your experience. If you are involved in harness racing currently, it offers the chance to see several racetracks and network with various people from horsemen to management personnel. If you have horse experience but not necessarily with harness racing, it offers the chance to learn about a totally new discipline as well as be exposed to possible career opportunities. As with any "internship" and no matter what your prior experience, you are bound to learn new things, will travel to interesting places, and have the opportunity to grow in your areas of interest.

If hired, you will need to submit your social security number so that a background check may be conducted. If the background check comes back with no areas of concern, you will then be "officially" hired to assist with HHYF camp programs for the summer!

Deadline for applications is February 1. Every effort will be made to complete the hiring process no later than March 15.
