

### A brief overview:

\*Since 1999, participants of our summer programs number in excess of 1200 "graduates"; we have traveled in excess of 200,000 miles from Alberta to Maine and from Ontario to Virginia.

\*Since 1978, HHYF has awarded and/or administered scholarships in excess of \$725,000 to more than 300 recipients.

\*On August 29, 2020 a random review of the simulcast program showed at least one HHYF alumni participating as a trainer or driver at all but one harness racetrack in North America as either a trainer or driver (and that doesn't even consider those working as caretakers or in management)!

This fall, Morgan, now 12, served as guest announcer for an entire racing card at the Shenandoah meet - one of the youngest ever to accomplish this!
