
Life & Times of the Great Dan Patch Festival IN



With retirement opening up free time, I was curious about the harness racing arena and possible ownership. I attended the Indiana Equine Round Up in March and inquired at the HHYF booth. I was encouraged to read the flyers and to call with any questions. I complied and that led me to sign up for three one day camps and a week long Leadership Camp as well. I volunteered at Breyerfest with HHYF and then was given an outstanding offer to attend camps in New York and New Jersey as an adult team leader.
